



The case of the Bluebell Ambush

Crime Scene: Bluebell Clearing

Deep within the quiet woodland glade, Hermione the Brown Hare was found lying peacefully among the bluebells.

Six suspects. One woodland death. But which creature brought Hermione's final dusk?



Background Report: Hermione the Brown Hare

Full Name: Hermione Cottonrun

Species: European Brown Hare (*Lepus europaeus*)

Age: Estimated 2 years

Known Associations: Meadow grazers, occasional chats with woodland birds

Personal History

Hermione was born on the open meadow fringe, raised on clover patches and quick instincts. A natural sprinter, she avoided conflict and preferred quiet corners of the forest. Her curiosity, however, often led her into places she didn't belong, especially near predator perches.

In her second year, Hermione began exploring deeper into the woods. She was known for her gentle nature, her habit of collecting smooth stones, and her tendency to wander at dusk.

She had no enemies, but she had a habit of overhearing things not meant for her ears.

Notable Traits

- **Quiet Observer:** Often seen listening more than speaking
- **Fast Runner:** Could evade most predators if she saw them coming
- **Routine-Breaker:** Changed her grazing spots frequently
- **Nervous Around Raptors:** Especially those who flew low

Last Known Activities

- Seen near Mossy Hollow, gathering clover
- Spotted speaking briefly with Barnaby the Eagle Owl
- Witnesses report she was lying low between bushes. Unusual behaviour for a hare
- A grey-white feather found near her resting spot

Questions for Investigation

- Why was Hermione moving so cautiously in the hours before her death?
- Was she being watched from above?
- Did she overhear something she shouldn't have?
- Who placed the feather upright beside her body and why?

Constable Billy Badger

Date: 03 August Time of Arrival: 06:12

Scene Overview

I arrived at Bluebell Clearing and found a disturbed patch of ground roughly 1.4 metres across. Soil was compressed in several places, with overlapping signs of movement. Hermione the Hare was located at the centre of the disturbance.

Ground Sign

- Multiple track impressions present, some clear, some partial.
- A drag line extends several metres north-northwest.
- Leaf litter displaced in several directions.
- No clear indication of how many individuals were involved.

Biological Trace

- Fur present on the ground and caught on low vegetation.
- A small amount of blood visible in a scattered pattern.
- One feather found near the disturbance.
- No clear indication of when each trace was deposited.

Vegetation Disturbance

- Several bluebells crushed or bent.
- One low branch shows recent scuffing.
- Moss disturbed beneath it.

Environmental Notes

- Mist lifting at time of arrival.
- Ground moisture moderate.
- No strong wind present that could have moved debris significantly.

Initial Observations (Non-Interpretive)

The scene shows:

- Signs of a struggle
- Multiple possible movement directions
- Mixed trace types
- No single clear indicator of species or individual

Operation Bluebell – Evidence Collection Statement

Wendy Weasel

Date: 03 August Time Logged: 06:34

Approach to Scene

I entered Bluebell Clearing from the southern edge, keeping to undisturbed ground. Billy had already marked the central area, so I began my sweep from the outer perimeter inward, recording anything that appeared recent.

Trace Items Collected

1. Fur

- Several small clumps of fur found on the ground and caught on low stems.
- Some pieces appear freshly detached; others may be older.
- No clear indication of how many sources the fur came from.

2. Feather

- One feather located close to the main disturbance.
- No obvious signs of how it arrived there.
- No additional feathers found in the immediate area.

3. Soil & Ground Material

- Soil samples taken from three points:
 - Central disturbance
 - Northern drag line
 - Western perimeter
- Each sample shows different levels of compression and moisture.

Track & Movement Sign

- Multiple partial tracks present; none complete enough to identify species.
- Some impressions show deeper pressure, others very light.
- One impression next to the hare is deep like something landed or jumped.
- A drag mark extends several metres but does not clearly indicate direction of origin.
- Leaf litter displaced in several arcs, with no single pattern dominating.

Vegetation Disturbance

- Several bluebells bent or crushed.
- One low branch shows recent scuffing, though the cause is unclear.

- Moss beneath the branch disturbed in a small patch.

Blood Pattern

- Small droplets and smears present.
- No clear directional pattern.
- No pooling outside the central disturbance.

Environmental Notes

- Mist lifting at time of collection.
- No strong wind present.
- Ground moisture moderate, making it difficult to determine age of some impressions.

Initial Evidence Summary (Non-Interpretive)

The scene contains:

- Mixed trace types
- Several possible movement directions
- One feather
- Multiple partial tracks
- Fur fragments

Operation Bluebell – Forensic Analysis Statement

Dr Hazel Hedgehog

Date: 03 August Time of Examination: 07:10

Overview

I received all collected trace items from Constable Billy Badger and Wendy Weasel. My examination was conducted at the scene to avoid disturbance of ground sign and to preserve context.

The following observations are strictly descriptive and non-interpretive.

Biological Material

Fur

- Multiple fragments present.
- Some pieces show clean separation; others appear more heavily damaged.
- Variation in condition suggests they may not all originate from the same moment or source.

Blood

- Several small droplets and smears located within the central disturbance.
- No clear directional pattern.
- No significant pooling outside the immediate area.

Feather

- One feather recovered.
- No clear indication of age or origin.
- No additional feathers found nearby to establish a pattern.

Ground & Soil Analysis

Compression Patterns

- Soil shows several areas of pressure, differing in depth and shape.
- Some impressions appear recent; others may be older.

Low Branch

- One branch shows recent scuffing.

- No clear indication of whether this relates to the central disturbance.

Additional Trace

- No manufactured objects found.
- No clear signs of prolonged activity.
- No evidence suggesting the involvement of more than one individual, though this cannot be ruled out.

Summary (Non-Interpretive)

The collected evidence includes:

- Fur fragments of varying condition
- A single feather
- Blood droplets and smears
- Multiple partial ground impressions
- A drag mark of uncertain origin
- Vegetation disturbance with no consistent pattern
- Soil compression in several locations

None of the trace items provide a definitive indication of species or individual. Further interpretation will require comparison with known movement patterns and behaviours.

Operation Bluebell – Suspect Statement

Greta the Goshawk

Date: 03 August Time Interviewed: 08:02

Greta's Account

I was travelling through the woodland early this morning. I moved across the clearing briefly but did not stop for long. The ground was damp, and I recall feeling the moisture on my feet as I passed through. I did not notice anything unusual at the time.

I did hear a sudden movement somewhere behind me, but I did not turn to look. The woods were quiet otherwise.

Location & Movements

Greta states she entered the clearing from the western side, moving in a straight line toward the old oak. She claims she did not approach the centre of the clearing and did not see Hermione.

She reports:

- Passing near a low branch
- Feeling disturbed air or movement nearby
- Leaving the clearing shortly after

Greta says she continued toward the ridge and did not return.

Awareness of the Scene

Greta denies seeing any disturbance on the ground. She states she did not notice fur, blood, or any sign of a struggle. She also denies leaving anything behind.

When asked whether she heard anything specific, she mentioned:

- “A quick sound, like something shifting the leaves.”
- “Possibly movement through vegetation.”

He mentions hearing “a quick rustle” somewhere deeper inside the clearing but assumed it was “just morning movement.”

Location & Movements

Rowan claims his route was:

- From the lower stream path
- Up toward the ridge
- Skirting the clearing without crossing it

He reports stopping briefly near a patch of moss to check for scents but says he did not detect anything unusual.

He denies leaving any trace intentionally and says he “didn’t notice anything out of place.”

Awareness of the Scene

Rowan states he did not see:

- Fur
- Blood
- Disturbed ground
- Any sign of Hermione
- Any sign of another individual

He mentions noticing “a shift in the air” and “some movement on the ground,” but nothing he considered unusual for that time of morning.

Barnaby claims his route took him:

- From the ridge path
- Down toward the clearing
- Along the northern boundary
- Then away toward the old stone stump

He says he paused briefly on a low branch to rest before continuing. He did not recall seeing Hermione or any disturbance.

Location & Movements

Bruce claims his route was:

- From the valley rise
- Over the clearing at moderate height
- Toward the far meadow beyond the ridge

He reports adjusting his path slightly due to a shift in air currents but says he did not land or stop near the clearing.

He denies leaving anything behind intentionally.

Awareness of the Scene

Bruce states he did not observe:

- Fur
- Blood
- Disturbed vegetation
- Any individuals on the ground
- Any sign of Hermione

When asked about sounds, he described:

- “A quick rustle, maybe leaves or something moving”

Location & Movements

Brock claims his route was:

- From the stream
- Up the slope toward the clearing
- Along the **south-western edge**
- Then onward toward the hollow log where he often rests

He reports stopping briefly near a patch of moss to check the ground, but says he did not see anything unusual. He denies leaving any trace intentionally.

Awareness of the Scene

Brock states he did not observe:

- Fur
- Blood
- Drag marks
- Any individuals
- Any sign of Hermione

When asked about sounds, he described:

- “A quick shift in the leaves”

- From the fallen birch
- Across the lower bracken line
- Along the southern edge of the clearing
- Then onward toward the meadow

She reports pausing briefly near a patch of flattened grass but says she did not see anything unusual there.

She denies leaving any trace intentionally.

Awareness of the Scene

Sally states she did not observe:

- Fur
- Blood
- Drag marks
- Any individuals
- Any sign of Hermione

When asked about sounds, she described:

- “Something shifting the leaves quickly”
- “Could’ve been anything moving through”
- “Didn’t seem close enough to worry about”

She did not investigate further.

Behaviour & Demeanour

Date: 03 August Time Interviewed: 10:14

Maple's Account

Maple states she was feeding near the lower bramble patch shortly after dawn. She reports hearing “a sudden movement” somewhere in Bluebell Clearing but did not see what caused it.

She says the sound was brief and made her pause, but nothing followed.

Location & Movements

Maple claims she remained:

- Near the bramble patch
- Facing toward the clearing
- At a distance where she could hear movement but not see details

She reports noticing a slight shift in vegetation but could not determine the source.

She did not approach the clearing.

Awareness of the Scene

Maple states she did not observe:

- Fur
- Blood
- Any individuals
- Any disturbance on the ground
- Hermione herself

When asked about sounds, she described:

- “Something quick, like leaves being pushed aside”
- “Not heavy, not slow”
- “Just one moment of movement”

She did not hear anything further.

Behaviour & Demeanour

Maple appeared cautious but calm. She answered questions clearly and did not attempt to guess what might have happened. She emphasised that she “didn’t go anywhere near the clearing.”

She stated she “only heard something, nothing more.”

Operation Bluebell – Witness Statement

Shelby the Snail

Date: 03 August Time Interviewed: 10:32

Shelby's Account

Shelby states he was travelling across a patch of damp moss near the western side of Bluebell Clearing during the early morning. He reports noticing “a sudden vibration through the ground,” but did not see what caused it.

He says the vibration was brief and made a few loose particles shift around him.

Location & Movements

Shelby claims he remained:

- On the moss patch
- Close to the ground
- Facing toward the clearing but not directly looking into it

He reports seeing a few pieces of leaf litter move slightly, though he could not determine the source.

He did not approach the centre of the clearing as it would have taken him ages to get there.

Awareness of the Scene

Shelby states he did not observe:

- Fur
- Blood
- Any individuals
- Any drag marks
- Hermione herself

When asked about sounds, he described:

- “A faint rustle, very quick”
- “Something shifting the leaves”
- “Hard to tell direction from where I was”

He did not hear anything else.

Behaviour & Demeanour

Shelby appeared calm and steady. He answered questions slowly and carefully, often pausing to recall details. He emphasised that he “didn’t move far” and “didn’t see anything clearly.”

He stated he “only felt something, not saw it.”

Operation Bluebell – Witness Statement

Burt the Frog

Date: 03 August Time Interviewed: 10:49

Burt's Account

Burt states he was positioned near the small pool on the northern side of Bluebell Clearing during the early morning. He reports hearing “a quick disturbance” somewhere beyond the water's edge but did not see what caused it.

He says the sound made a ripple across the surface of the pool, though he could not tell from which direction it originated.

Location & Movements

Burt claims he remained:

- On a flat stone beside the pool
- Facing toward the clearing
- Close enough to hear movement but too far to see details

He reports noticing a slight shift in nearby reeds but could not determine the cause.

He did not leave the pool area.

Awareness of the Scene

Burt states he did not observe:

- Fur
- Blood
- Any individuals
- Any ground disturbance
- Hermione herself

When asked about sounds, he described:

- “A single quick movement, like something brushing past vegetation”
- “Not loud, not heavy”
- “Just enough to make the water react”

He did not hear anything further.

Behaviour & Demeanour

Burt appeared calm and steady. He answered questions plainly and did not attempt to interpret what he heard. He emphasised that he “didn't leave the poolside” and “didn't see anything clearly.”

He stated he “only heard something and saw the water react.”

Operation Bluebell – Pathologist Report

Dr Hazel Hedgehog, Woodland Forensic Unit

Date of Examination: 03 August Time: 07:42 Location: Bluebell Clearing (on-site examination)

Subject

Hermione the Hare Adult Found deceased at the centre of a disturbed ground area.

Condition on Discovery

The subject was located lying on her right side. No signs of prolonged struggle were visible on the body. Fur was partially disrupted in several areas.

Environmental conditions at time of examination:

- Ground moisture moderate
- Mist lifting
- Ambient temperature cool

External Examination

1. Fur Condition

- Multiple patches of fur missing.
- Some areas show clean detachment; others show more irregular separation.
- No clear indication of how many events contributed to the loss.

2. Skin & Surface Wounds

- Several small surface abrasions present.
- One larger wound located on the left flank.
- Edges of the wound show sudden-force characteristics but do not indicate the specific mechanism. They look like puncture type wounds evenly spaced, penetrating through fur and skin.

3. Blood Distribution

- Light blood staining around the flank wound.
- Small droplets present on nearby fur.
- No extensive pooling beneath the body.

4. Limbs

- Forelimbs show no fractures.
- Hindlimbs show mild stiffness consistent with early post-mortem changes.
- No dislocations detected.

5. Head & Neck

- No visible fractures.
- One small abrasion behind the left ear.
- No clear indication of directionality.

Internal Examination

(Conducted externally only; no invasive procedures performed due to field conditions.)

1. Palpation Findings

- Ribcage shows no obvious fractures.
- Abdomen firm but consistent with early post-mortem state.
- No detectable internal displacement through external palpation.

2. Flank Wound Assessment

- Depth moderate.
- Edges irregular.
- No clear pattern indicating the exact cause.
- Wound does not conclusively indicate tool use, bite, or impact.

Associated Trace on Body

- Several small fur fragments adhered to the wound edges.
- One small piece of vegetation caught in hindleg fur.
- No manufactured objects present.
- No clear trace indicating species of assailant.

Estimated Time of Death

Based on:

- Body temperature
- Rigor development
- Environmental conditions

Estimated time of death: Approximately 1–2 hours prior to discovery. (This is an estimate only; environmental factors may affect accuracy.)

Cause of Death (Non-Interpretive)

The subject's death appears to result from:

- A single sudden traumatic event
- Leading to rapid incapacitation
- Followed by minimal subsequent movement

The exact mechanism cannot be determined from available evidence.

Operation Bluebell – Toxicology Report

Dr Hazel Hedgehog, Woodland Forensic Unit

Date of Analysis: 03 August Time: 08:15 Location: Bluebell Clearing (field laboratory kit)

Specimen Collection

Samples were taken from the subject at the scene to avoid altering chemical composition through transport.

Collected specimens include:

- Surface fur swabs
- Blood droplets from flank wound
- Soil adjacent to the body
- Vegetation fragments found in hindleg fur
- Water sample from nearby pool (control comparison)

All samples were processed using standard woodland field-toxicology procedures.

Blood Analysis

Findings

- No detectable traces of manufactured toxins.
- No evidence of common environmental contaminants (e.g., agricultural run-off, industrial residue).
- Normal biochemical markers for a hare of Hermione's age and condition.
- No elevated levels of stress-related metabolites beyond what would be expected in a sudden traumatic event.

Interpretation (Non-Interpretive)

The blood sample does not indicate poisoning, chemical incapacitation, or ingestion of harmful substances.

Fur & Skin Swab Analysis

Findings

- Trace amounts of soil consistent with the clearing's substrate.
- Minor plant oils from surrounding vegetation.
- No unusual chemical residues.
- No irritants or corrosive substances detected.
- No foreign particulate matter that suggests external chemical involvement.

Interpretation (Non-Interpretive)

Fur and skin samples show only environmental contact consistent with natural woodland conditions.

Soil Sample (Adjacent to Body)

Findings

- Moisture level moderate.
- No chemical abnormalities.
- No signs of recent contamination by substances not naturally present in the clearing.
- Mineral content consistent with surrounding area.

Interpretation (Non-Interpretive)

Soil composition does not indicate the presence of any toxic agents.

Vegetation Fragment Analysis

Findings

- Plant matter consistent with local species.
- No evidence of chemical treatment or residue.
- No toxins present in quantities capable of causing harm.

Interpretation (Non-Interpretive)

Vegetation fragments do not indicate ingestion or exposure to harmful substances.

Water Sample (Control)

Findings

- No contaminants detected.
- Normal mineral and organic content for a woodland pool.
- No correlation with any trace found on the subject.

Overall Toxicology Summary (Non-Interpretive)

Across all samples:

- No toxins detected
- No chemical incapacitation
- No environmental contaminants
- No manufactured substances
- No plant-based poisons
- No abnormal biochemical markers
- No evidence of ingestion or exposure to harmful agents

Conclusion: Hermione's death does not appear to involve any toxic substance. All findings are consistent with a non-chemical, non-poisonous, sudden physical event.

Summary of Examination

Hermione the Hare was examined on-site by Dr Hazel Hedgehog, Woodland Forensic Pathologist. The examination included:

- External assessment
- Non-invasive internal palpation
- Toxicology screening
- Environmental trace comparison
- edvi

All findings were documented in the accompanying reports.

Key Forensic Findings (Non-Interpretive)

The subject exhibited:

- One significant wound on the left flank
- Several minor abrasions
- Fur loss of varying types
- Light blood staining
- No fractures detected externally
- No manufactured objects present
- No chemical or toxic substances detected
- No definitive directional indicators
- No clear species-specific trace on the body

Environmental evidence included:

- Mixed ground impressions
- A drag mark of uncertain origin
- One feather
- Several fur fragments
- Disturbed vegetation and Soil compression in multiple locations

None of these items conclusively indicate the identity of the assailant.

Estimated Time of Death

Based on environmental conditions and early post-mortem changes:

Estimated time of death: Approximately 1–2 hours prior to discovery.

This estimate may be affected by temperature, moisture, and ground conditions.

Cause of Death

The subject's death appears consistent with:

- A single sudden traumatic event
- Resulting in rapid incapacitation
